Works for Active Members of the Legion of Mary Approved by the Concilium

- 1. Home visitation of any kind
- 2. Nursing home and hospital visits
- Institution visits to jails, prisons, halfway houses, alcoholics, unwed mothers, handicapped, mentally ill, retirement, etc.
- 4. Bringing Holy Communion to the sick or shut-ins, but not during Mass at Church
- 5. Organizing and conducting catechism classes for children and adults (RCIA,OCIA, etc.) as long as no pay is accepted
- 6. Lecturing for Right to Life at workshops, schools, etc. by Legionaries only.
- Counseling in front of abortion clinics, but not picketing. Legionaries must do the work in pairs in a quiet and nonagressive manner.
- 8. Street work such as book barrow, personal contact on the street, at bars, etc., park rosary, working in booths at fairs, etc., as long as you are promoting religion and / or the Legion
- Distribution of Catholic literature at bus depots, on bus seats, jails, doctor's offices, hospitals, nursing homes, etc.
- 10. Transporting those in need to Mass, CCD, doctors, stores, etc.
- 11. Baby sitting (without pay) small children, sick or elderly so family can attend Mass or other Catholic services, go to the doctor, shopping, etc.
- 12. Recruiting members for parish societies (work done in other organizations of itself does not fulfill Legion duty)
- 13. Enthronement or promotion of Enthronement of the Sacred Heart
- 14. Preparing engaged couples for marriage, or instructing persons to receive other sacraments
- 15. PPC work, Exploratio Dominicalis or Sunday Search for Souls
- 16. Extension work, Columban Drives, Patricians, Junior Praesidia, etc.
- 17. Acting as an officer of a Junior Praesidium
- 18. Serving at funeral dinners (if assigned, and especially in cases where no one else is available)
- 19. Conducting of children clubs, such as Boys and Girls Scouts etc.
- Phoning of auxiliaries and shut-ins. (Ideally, this work should be <u>limited</u> to those who are unable to do more active work.)
- 21. Recruiting and aftercare of auxiliaries
- 22. Conducting of a religious service when no priest is available
- 23. Preparing homes of the blind or sick for the visit of a priest
- 24. Promoting of the Pilgrim statue (not mere attendance)
- 25. Promoting and preparation of validation of marriages and other sacraments
- 26. Recitation of the rosary at wakes and funerals if assigned by the Praesidium
- 27. Organizing rosary groups and the teaching of how to make rosaries
- 28. Setting up and teaching Bible classes
- 29. The setting up and or the conducting of an evening of recollection for auxiliaries
- 30. Organizing Holy Hours or All Night Vigils (the mere attendance does not constitute Legion work
- 31. Service in soup lines if assigned and Legion is not providing food
- 32. Probation counseling for delinquent boys and girls (drugs etc.)
- 33. Follow-up of boys and girls seen at juvenile hall after they have returned home
- 34. Any work assigned by the Pastor as long as it has nothing to do with the collection of money or material assistance.
- 35. Exceptions are made for the elderly and handicapped as whatever they are capable of doing would be acceptable for their assignment (revised 9/2000)
